THERAPY CORNER

This month I would like to discuss how you can stay active during the colder months.

As colder weather approaches, we tend to be less active. We want to hunker down and not get out unless necessary. Those who love to get outdoors tend to decrease activity as it is almost too cold to go outside. As enticing as staying in a warm room sounds, it is imperative to maintain some level of physical activity.

We are fortunate to have long hallways. Use these to your advantage, and walk some laps a couple of times daily. Unfortunately, the short walk to the dining room is not sufficient activity. A 10-15 minute walk two times a day will make a difference in how you feel and your overall well-being.

Make it a social event by walking in small groups. Meet at the same time each day. Or make it more challenging by timing yourself and trying to improve your time.






