This month I would like to discuss something I had touched on in previous articles, which is being active. This time of year, as the colder weather approaches, we all tend to become less active. We want to hunker down in our warm rooms and not get out unless it is just absolutely needed. Those of us who love to get outdoors really tend to decrease our activity as it is almost impossible to get outside.

As enticing as staying in a warm room sounds, it is imperative to maintain some level of physical activity. You are fortunate here at Regency to have long hallways. Please use these to your advantage! Get out in the hallway and make some laps a couple of times a day.

I know most of you are saying, "Well, I walk down to the dining room," and that is great, but you need a little

more activity. A 10–15 minute walk at least two times a day can make a tremendous difference in how you feel and your overall well-being. 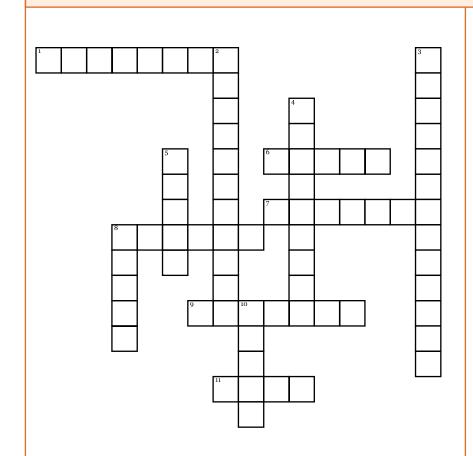

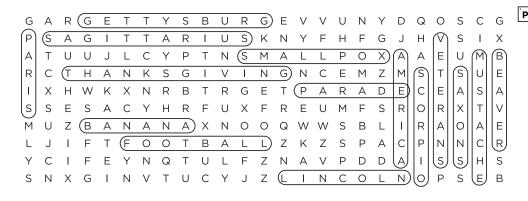
Clover Lennon

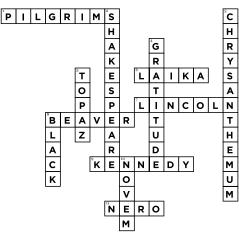
