THERAPY CORNER

Welcome to another edition of Therapy Corner.

As December approaches and cold weather sets in, I want to address a concern that affects a large portion of the population this time of year: the flu.

The CDC reports that flu activity starts to increase in October and November, peaking between December and February, and sometimes lasting into May. Some risk factors that increase the likelihood of flu include asthma, neurologic conditions, chronic lung diseases (such as COPD and cystic fibrosis), diabetes, heart diseases, people with weakened immune systems due to disease, and those residing in long-term care facilities. The CDC strongly recommends a yearly flu vaccine as the first and most important preventive measure. Make sure to consult with your physician before getting the vaccine.

Additional tips to help prevent the flu include avoiding close contact with sick individuals, washing your hands frequently with soap and water or using a hand sanitizer if soap and water are unavailable, refraining from touching your eyes, nose, and mouth to prevent the spread of germs, and regularly cleaning and disinfecting surfaces and objects that may be contaminated. Lastly, remember to cover your nose and mouth when sneezing, preferably using a tissue or your elbow (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention).

I hope you find this information helpful and wish you a healthy and joyous holiday season.




Janette Edmondson
